Yesterday, I watched a teacher teaching a Year 3/4 class Indonesian. It was an engaging lesson. Not only were the students learning to speak and understand Indonesian, but their teacher was asking probing questions, the 'why do you think', 'what could be the reason' type questions. She was helping students make the connections between English and Indonesian, comparing the two languages. Students were talking about the position of adjectives and the use of suffixes. It really was an excellent lesson. You could see students making meaning of what they were learning. That lesson reinforced my belief that the learning of any language be it Indonesian, French or Japanese has a multitude of benefits, and once you have grasped a second language, it becomes easier to learn other languages.






## German Junior A The Very Hungry Caterpillar
